Pastors' Ponderings

We've all heard that old saying, "There's nothing certain except for death and taxes." However, that has been amended with the addition of CHANGE! We live in an age where change is not only inevitable, it also occurs at a rapid pace.

All of us, at some level, resist change. Change means we may have to give up something or lose something, we may have to learn something new or adapt to a new way of thinking or being.

What we've discovered, however, is that no matter how much we resist change, how much we fight against and attempt to block change, CHANGE still happens.

The writer of the Psalms knew all too well about change. A number of the Psalms are representations of prayers in the midst of change. One verse, in particular, is easy to remember: "God is our refuge and strength, a very present help in trouble. Therefore we will not fear, though the earth should change, though the mountains shake in the heart of the sea; though its waters roar and foam, though the mountains tremble with its tumult."

So though change is inevitable and uncontrollable, we know that we are never alone as we confront it. The certainty of our faith is that God loves with a steadfast love - a love that is available for the asking.

When the fears begin to rise, when our resistance becomes nearly insurmountable, try leaving go and falling into God's arms. Then wait and watch as God strengthens you day by day to live with and learn from life's changes.

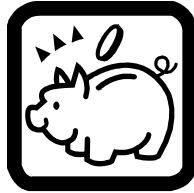

June Mission Project



300-400 toothbrushes..'

WHAT?

We've been asked by the New Wilmington Mission Conference if our church will supply the toothbrushes to be used in their mission project during the conference this July. They'll be making up hygiene kits for Church World Service and would like us to supply all the toothbrushes. That's 300 – 400 toothbrushes....

WHY?

These hygiene kits are sent to people in disaster situations, whether in Kentucky or Kenya, to supply them with their basic hygiene needs, along with the CWS blankets that you might be familiar with. We know disasters are going to happen; we just don't know when. Let's help CWS to be prepared in advance.

So when you shop, please consider buying a few toothbrushes each week. Look for the bargains and get the ones on sale. Any kind is fine, but they must be individually packaged.

WHERE?

Look for the Toothbrush Angel Baskets in the narthex and in the rear of the church area next to Rooms A/B, and donate your toothbrushes there.

WHEN?

We're collecting for 6 Sundays. **The deadline is July 12.**

WHO?

You. Me. All of us! If everyone buys a couple of toothbrushes every week, we'll make our **goal of 400!! We can do it!**



A check in the amount of **\$1,064.00** was mailed to Family Promise of Monmouth County last month. That represents the total profit from our Pasta Dinner/Fun Bingo night and the next day sale of baked goods and sauce that you helped to raise! Thank you all for your kind support of this vital mission. Family Promise uses contributions from Host Congregations like ours to help defray some of the daily operational costs of running a Day Center.

I learned at a recent Coordinator's meeting that there has been a temporary moratorium placed on the acceptance of new families into the network. The reason is that the Day Center, which is the former rectory of St. Mark's Church in Keansburg, is dilapidated and would be too costly to fix. The roof leaks badly and the house has been deemed unsuitable for living. This is where the guests go after leaving the congregations each morning to bathe, do laundry, send and receive mail and work on their independence issues like job and house searching, counseling and education. It is for all intents and purposes their "home". For this reason a new Day Center must be found.

There are two places being considered as temporary locations until the permanent move to Fort Monmouth in 2012. The Salvation Army in Tinton Falls and Holy Communion Church in Fair Haven have offered to rent some space. Both locations have issues such as zoning and/or rejection by the town officials. The Family Promise Board of Directors is asking that we spread the word of their need for a mixed-use zone space to rent. Please contact me if you have any ideas that I can present to them and please keep Family Promise in your prayers until they are once more up and running.

Our last family has left the program, and so until further notice, we can all take a deep breath and relax as Family Promise undergoes permanent changes both in location and management. Katie Maier's position is interim director and so a full time permanent director is being sought. Even with these temporary set backs, the board expects to make a full recovery and emerge even stronger after the relocation and placement of a new management team. Look for an update in the July/August newsletter to see where we are with hosting. Our next rotation is scheduled for July 19th-25th.

In the meantime we can still support Family Promise by keeping them in our prayers, keeping alert to housing options, and also by dining out. How? Pick up a flyer in the narthex or C.E. building, by the coffee corner, to Dine at Applebee's of Tinton Falls on June 16th from 5:00pm till 8:00pm and 10% of your bill will be donated! Check out the most recent F.P. newsletter on the Mission board in the auditorium along with some photos of last year's Bake Sale and Pasta Dinner/Bingo. As always, thank you for your love, support and patience while God performs another miracle to help His children.
