SESSION HIGHLIGHTS

At their November 15th meeting:

- Heard statements of faith from new members
- Approved the Cookie Sale proceeds to go toward the purchase of new tables for the Auditorium
- Approved 1/2 of the loose offering on Christmas Eve to go to our local Church World Service group and 1/2 to Mortgage Principle Reduction.
- Approved the Sanctuary being on the Freehold Christmas House tour on December 10, 5pm-8pm.
- Discussed ways to continue to reach out to those who have not been active in the life of the church and to others who may be looking for a church home.
- Appointed the Budget Task Force: Wendy Jaghab, Ted Schulz, Will Schartel and Karen Giurici, with Pastor David as advisor.
- Learned that the Brinckherhoff house should be demolished in December and that the Freehold Boro Fire Company was given permission to use it for training purposes up to that point; those in training will be required to sign a release of liability form.
- Heard a report of a potential renter for our first floor space—a small pre-school. Pastor David and Mike Minden are working with the owner and are sharing information back with the Session.

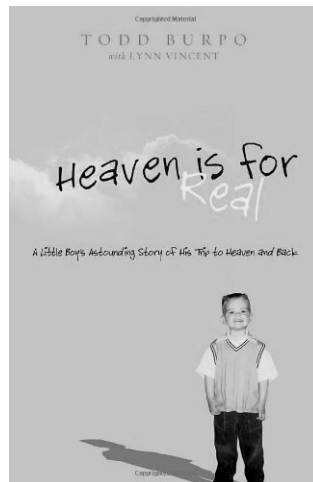


COLLEGE STUDENT SUNDAY SCHOOL CLASS

Do You Know Your Envelopes?

Contribution to Mortgage Fund

These envelopes are provided for contributions to liquidate our mortgage obligation. You are asked to assist in this effort by making a regular contribution to this account. Money received will be applied to the mortgage principle; reducing our interest expense costs associated with the mortgage. Making additional principal payments to a mortgage can take years and thousands of dollars off the cost of mortgage.

Per Capita Envelope

Each Presbyterian congregation is required to pay designated amounts for each member on the active member rolls, to the presbytery, synod and general assembly. This year we are required to pay \$37 per member, or over \$13,000.

Initial Offering Envelope

This envelope is for you to donate toward the cost of providing the envelopes. We ask you to give **\$5 per box**.

Building Preservation Fund Envelope

First Presbyterian Church is blessed with wonderful facilities. In order to maintain our building, however, we have set aside a special fund to be used for major projects. The congregation must approve the use of monies from the Building Preservation fund. ****THIS IS NOT MONEY TO BE USED FOR THE MORTGAGE REPAYMENT.**

Weekly Offering Envelope

The white envelopes in the offering envelope box are to be used for your pledges/offering for the general budget. This includes fund for the monthly mortgage payment, in addition to the funds for staff, utilities, programs and ministries of the church.

Deacons' Fund Envelope

The Deacons carry out essential ministry of compassion and care for our congregation. Their Budget is not included in the general budget. Their only source of income is through the Deacon envelopes found in your offering envelope box.

Church Fundraisers

Community Luncheon Fundraiser ended the 2011 year in October with **\$2,543 profit.**

Our total so far, over the years, for the Property Memorial Fund is \$10,900. This was accomplished by our Committee who sets up tables, place settings, makes soup, salads, sandwiches, waitresses, washes dishes and silverware, prepares takeout and delivers to Board of Elections, makes items for the bake sale table, and takes and counts the money.

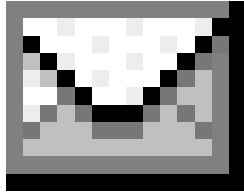
A special thanks to many Church volunteers who supply homemade pies and cakes for our dessert table and to our loyal workers.

Below are some ways you can help the counters and financial secretaries quickly and accurately count and record all tithes.

- *For your pledge/general offering, please use the white offering envelopes provided to you at the beginning of the year. If you need a box, please see our Church and Financial Secretary Kathy McLaughlin.*
- *Please put your offering envelope number (it's in the upper right corner) in the memo line on your check.*
- *If you miss a week, you can combine multiple weeks offering into one white offering envelope.*
- *Use the white offering envelope only for your pledge/general offering. All other offerings, such as Deacons, Building Preservation Fund, Per Capita, etc., should be placed in their appropriate envelopes – green for Deacons, pink for Building Preservation Fund, etc.*
- *If you do use the pew envelopes and wish to receive credit for tax purposes, please neatly write in your name and address on the envelope.*

The end of the year is approaching. Finance Commission is requesting that any offering/donations for 2011 be received by Sunday December 25th. If you will be mailing your offering in, please make sure it will be in the church office by Thursday, December 22nd.

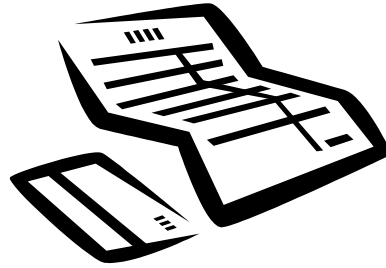
