As we return to the full schedule of church activities, there is an important question we urge you to ask yourself: Are you spiritually asleep . . . or is your faith alive and growing?

In the Gospel of Matthew, Jesus said, "Truly I tell you, unless you change and become like little children, you will never enter the kingdom of heaven." Why little children? Think about a little child – two characteristics stand out: energy and enthusiasm. Little children never seem to tire and they are excited by the simplest activities.

Jesus wants us to be enthusiastic about our faith and to show it by serving Him through the church. What is enthusiasm? It means an abundant joy and an excitement about the work God is doing. In Greek it means, "God in Us". It is a zeal, a zest for living, a positive excitement for God. It is a must for Christians, keeping us going through life's journey.

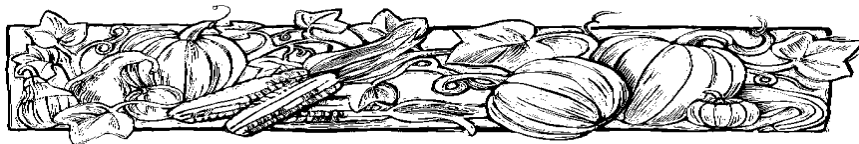

MAKES A DIFFERENCE

The 3 & 4 year olds will meet in Room 2 on the first floor of the Christian Education Building; Kindergarten through grade 5 will participate in Rotation Sunday School classes which will be held on the Second Floor of the Christian Education Building. COFFEE CORNER

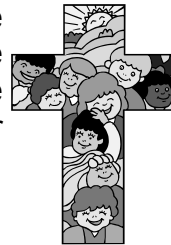

FAMILY PROMISE UPDATE

We had a full house for Family Promise during our last hosting last month. In all, 19 guests made our church their temporary residence during that week. Two families left the program mid-week and then another family of four joined us for the last two nights. It was a busy week!

The guests were very appreciative of our hospitality and one family in particular told me several times how grateful they were for what we were doing. Both Mom and Dad just happen to lose their jobs at the same time and are having a hard time finding work. Neither of them thought they would ever be in a position where they couldn't afford to pay rent, or that they would EVER have to ask for assistance from a program like Family Promise. A lot of the families that come to us through Family Promise have similar stories. These are not the cliché "homeless people" that movies portray. A woman at one of the previous hostings confided in me that she had been making six figures as an executive and got laid off. Again, due to the state of the economy she could not find another job and after several months lost her home. She felt humiliated at having to accept help from strangers, and felt so helpless at times.

"Thank you!!" to all the volunteers that show compassion for these temporarily displaced families by volunteering in some way – Coordinators "in training" (Mary Jo Welsch, Judi Cavicchio); Kelley and Mike Santangelo for picking up/returning the linens for the beds; those that set up the rooms by blowing up the air mattresses and making the beds (Spendley family, Melanie Pascullo, Sandra Whitehill, Will Schartel); those that shopped and purchased a weeks worth of lunch food and staples for the 5 families (Sue Craig, Mary Randolph); those that purchased and cooked food for up to 17 people at a time and accommodated some of the more picky eaters at the last minute (Christy McCoy, Anne and Gabby Kovacs, Carol Matino, Tammy Kane, Diane Canto, Nancee Hanley, Beth Sulzberg, Jill Niehaus and the group from Colts Neck Reformed Church, Robin Fox, Doris Mayhew, Brenda Fitzgerald, did I miss anyone?); those that stayed and socialized with the guests and played with (and cleaned up after) the children (Dave Kiessling, Laura Gugger, Bill McLean, Karen Giurici, Pastor David, Susan Beaton, Patsy Saylor, Judi Cavicchio, Melanie Pascullo, Kayla Ciok); those that slept over and made breakfast in the morning (Will and Melissa Schartel, Steve Buffett, Jan Mundy, Lenora Chu, Chris Giurici, Pastor David, Larry Moran, Bob DiSogra, Sandra and Howard Whitehill); and those that put everything away when it was all over (Whitehills, Will Schartel, Mary Randolph, Sue Craig, Mel Pascullo). You may not realize it, but these small gestures mean so much to these families in need. I have been told several times by guests that they think the Family Promise program is wonderful and that they plan to "pay it forward" once they get back on their feet and are able to help others as they were helped.

Our next hosting is **November 6**. If you haven't helped out before, please consider jumping in to help during the next round! It will be a gratifying and rewarding experience for you and a much needed contribution to the Family Promise mission.

BAPTISM PROCEDURES

Baptism is one of 2 Sacraments in the Presbyterian Church; it is the sign and seal through which we are joined to Christ. As we are baptized with water, Christ baptizes us with His Spirit, washing away our sins. Baptism is also a sign that we are included in God's grace and covenant with the Church. Therefore, we are called to respond to that grace.

In our tradition, baptism is an act of the congregation. It is not solely between you and God; it is an important moment for the church, for the parents and the child as we all acknowledge that God has joined us together through Christ. We believe baptism is an important commitment for the one being baptized, or in the case of infant baptism, for the parents. The Session takes the commitment in the Sacrament of Baptism very seriously and wants to help those who request this sacrament to understand it more fully.

Therefore, you must attend a baptism class before you can request a Baptism date. The last class for 2011 will be held at 9am on Saturday, October 8. Call the church office at 732-462-0234 to sign up.

Once you have taken the class and have decided you want to apply, you may choose one of the Baptism Sundays. By having special worship services set aside for baptism, we hope to have the congregation better understand this sacrament and their part in it. Parents will also be asked to meet with the session to talk about their faith and intent for baptism.



Presbyterian Women

Circles are designed to provide for the individual woman of the church personal fellowship that will cause her to feel she has the support of friends who have an interest in and concern for her. The circle's highest service is to help persons inside the church become aware of the power of Christ to create a redeeming fellowship that gives support to persons in all of life's experiences, and to help persons outside the membership of the church come to know and accept Christ and desire the fellowship of His church.

Praise Team - Meets on Wednesday at 6:00pm, Sings Sundays at 8:30 am Youth and Adults are welcome

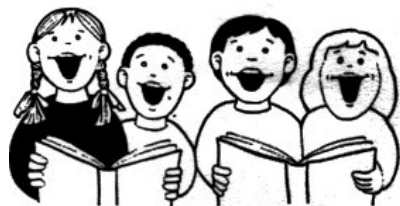

Two exciting new opportunities

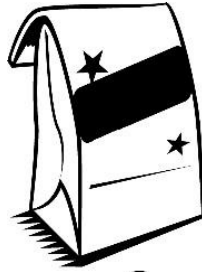
